Some of the wider sustainability benefits of applying this hierarchy include, improving local air quality, reducing congestion and traffic, and improving your health and wellbeing.


Whatever your reason for visiting, this guide contains a wide range of helpful transport information.

Walking

Walking is the cheapest form of transport! Not only is it cheap, but a brisk one-mile walk in 20 minutes burns around 100 calories; so over a working week walking to work and back can burn off an entire day's calorie intake!

Cycling

Tram

The nearest train station is West Croydon serving direct train line(s). There are direct trams from both West, East Croydon and Wimbledon. Ampere Way is the nearest stop and only a 6 minute walk from the Valley Retail & Leisure Park (see map on reverse).

Bus

The nearest bus stops to this site are located at Ampere Tram station, which is a 6 minute walk away and at Beddington Farm Road/Purley Way, which is a 12 minute walk away. This area is served by the **289**, **455** and **663** bus routes with destinations including West Croydon Station, South Croydon Station and Purley.

Electric Vehicles are far less polluting than Internal Combustion Engines and have many other flow-on benefits for the user and community at large. 5 Electric Vehicle charging points are available to use on-site. These are free of charge to the user and allocated specifically for Disabled Badge Holders and Electric Vehicles only. They can be found next to DFS on the Leisure side of the park.

Disability Access is provided throughout the park. There are a number of parking bays allocated specifically to Disabled Badge Holders, and access to both Retail & Leisure parks is provided to make your stay as convenient as possible.
